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Copyright Challenges for Digital Museums

Copyright protection

- Works of literature and art
- Original works // individual character
- Term of protection
- Exclusive rights
 - Right of reproduction
 - Right of making available

Challenges for Museums

- Lack of legal certainty, reputational risks etc.
- Transaction costs





Meeting the Challenges: Exception for Orphan Works

Orphan works

- Right holders not identified or not located
- Diligent search in good faith

Permitted uses

- Uses by museums, libraries, archives and other cultural heritage institutions
- Reproduction and making available
- Indication of name of authors and other right holders

> Role of collective management organizations

- Grant permission
- Collect remuneration





Meeting the Challenges: Extended Collective Licenses

Scope of application

- No exception, no individual licenses granted
- Collective management organization (CMO) may allow for use of rights in large number of works and collect remuneration

Conditions and restrictions

- CMO must be representative for such works
- No conflict with normal exploitation
- Right holders may opt out

Potential ways forward

 Creative commons license for uses by (digital) cultural heritage institutions
